## POONA-THE QUEEN OF DECCAN Through ancient Postcards Mr. Ambika Samantray


Poona, known as the Queen of Deccan, is a sprawling city in the western Indian state of Maharashtra. It was once the base of the Peshwas (prime ministers) of the Maratha Empire, which lasted from 1674 to 1818. The city of Pune was known as Poona during British rule. Poona Municipality was established in 1858. A railway line from Bombay to the city opened in 1858. Pune has historically been a major cultural centre. Pune is also often referred to as "Oxford of the East" because of its highly regarded educational institutions in the city.

#### Heritage Railway Station



The Railway Station, a kilometre northwest of the Pune cantonment, was at first a small group of stone buildings with three platforms and the usual sheds and stores. Soon it became a focal point for a settlement of railway staff and some Europeans and Indians. Below is a picture postcard Pune railway station from year 1910.

## **General Post Office building**




The General Post office was built close to the station, replacing the original simple structure in 1873-74. The present building was probably reconstructed from the original in the early decades of the twentieth century.

#### **Budhwar Peth**




This sector was the commercial district or market network. The lively and interesting street front presented a variety of facades. The upper floors were mostly used as residences.

## **Reay Market**



The central market, named after Governor Reay (now Jyotiba Phule Market, and referred to as Mandai)

consists of a large octagonal central tower with Gothic features and arms radiating from it. This hadbecome a common plan for nineteenth century markets allover India. The arms housed the vendors' stalls, while the tower was used as municipal offices.




Here is a picture postcard of the market postally used to England in 1908.

## Ram Temple, Tulshibaug




Ram Temple shikhara, Tulshibag: This 140 ft. high shikhara, the tallest in Maharashtra, was• added in the nineteenth century. It is typical of the Maratha style, with storeys arranged in an elegant pyramid.

#### St. Mary's Church



The Church, built in 1825, became the focal point of the religious life of the European troops and officers. It was the first Protestant church in Pune, meant for the use of the garrison.

#### Shaniwar Wada



Built by Baji Rao I, the fortified palace complex was witness to many significant events of Maratha history, and has come to be a symbol of the city. Only the massive stone walls, bastions and the huge main gate with a wooden music gallery above it remain today.

## Heritage Postal building at Jharsuguda




## THE CITY WITH A CROWN LETTER BOX- Kasbe Pune



Last December, I have the chance to visit the city Poona-with lots of philatelic interest documented by Department of Post. Before starting my journey to the city, I have listed from a catalogue, the public visiting places that had already

in postage stamps or stationery. There are two main attractions in my enlisted were district level

exhibition PUNEPEX'2023 and the Jyotirlinga Bhimashankar. But, to my surprise the city offer





The first target travel was to historical mansion Shaniwar wada, the residence of the Peshwas, the pride of Maharastra. The original foundation stone was laid by Peshwa Bajirao and construction completed in 1732 AD. The successors were made several additions like fortifications walls with

five gateways, nine bastions that enclosed the whole complex. The main

entrance gate is Dilli Darwaja, followed by Mastani, Khidaki, Ganeshand Narayan Darwaja respectively. The Shaniwar Peth Sub post office, situated near by provides a permanent pictorial postmark, for the philatelist to carry memories.

The city name changed to Poona during British regime in 1857 which had the architectural Italian arches and spacious lawns, garden Agakhan Palace currently maintained by Gandhi National Memorial Society. This marvel building famous when Mahatma Gandhi, wife Kasturba Gandhi and his Secretary cum friend, Mahadev Desai were detained for about 2 years by the British in 1942, following Quit India Movement. Both, Mahadev Desai and Kasturba Gandhi had their last breath at the rear side of the palace with marble memorials. There are many halls in this 3 storey palace



showing large paintings and photographs narrating the life of Mahatma Gandhi and other leaders besides giving glimpses of the freedom movement.



The Victorian era GPO building at Queen's garden since inception in 1855 still carried lots of ostentatious memories such as crown letter box, heritage building status in 2000 and the 'zero milestone' right outside. The well preserved main structure, ending in a dome with Indo-Islamic influence, attracted visitors with a plaque is a tribute to Andrea Palladio, a 16th-century Italian Renaissance architect. The Tuscan columns in the veranda, arched windows with enlarged keystones and wedge-shaped stone, rusticated corners and typical



railings balusters, parapets and high-ceilinged halls. The historical treasure letter box with crown of Elizabeth II on the top is an added attraction for philatelist to send from this letterbox bear a special pictorial stamp cancellation.

The Zero stone was originally placed during the Great Trigonometrical Survey, India's mapping and surveying heritage conducted between 1800 and 1860 served as a reference point with a known elevation relative to the mean sea level.



Another, postal interest was to visit the Fergusson College which has completed Centenary years with pride. The foundation stone of the Main building was laid in 1892 and the building was completed in 1895. The british era educational institute built in the Gothic style with basalt stone. The Government of India released a postal stamp with a beautiful portrait


of the Main Building embossed had been painted by an internationally acclaimed artist, Shri Gopal Deuskar. I have witnessed a tiny modern red letter box (Round mark) in




front of the main building which still delivered letters to far and distance as told by the security.




Located in Western part of the city, the Savitribai Phule University (Formerly known as University of Pune) established in 1949 has since become one of the leading centres for research and teaching in the



country. The University remember and honour a remarkable woman who fought for girls' education and sparked a revolution in India. Deccan College located near famous Yerawada jail was developed as one of the leading institutes for higher education, training and research completed bicentenary and depicted on a postage stamp of 2021.





The culinary excellence since 1935 by Poona guest house has been recognized for Pune's cultural tapestry. PUNEPEX 2023 was celebrated during 7-8 December at Balgandhava Art Gallery, saw the unveiling of two special covers featuring Shinde Chhatri, Pune and Poona Guest house.

Headgears or turban of Pune area was witnessed symbol of pride and Honor of the city since



17th Century. This pagadi has received a Geographical indication (GI) Status in 2009.

The Armed Force Medical College (AFMC) is leading medical Institute completed platinum Jubilee in 2012. This centre is

globally acknowledge as a centre of excellence and received President's colour in 2023 for exceptional service.

## **Poona Philatelic Bureau**

The philatelic bureau in general post office is a treasure trove of philately. The bureau was opened on August 28, 1977. There are various philatelic stamps and Stationery available for enthaustas stamp lovers all of them pinned up in display boards.



## **The Pigeon**

The pigeon, a bird with extensive historical ties to humanity, has served various roles as a symbol, sacrifice, messenger, and food source. Despite its significant contributions throughout the centuries, the pigeon is now often viewed as a civic nuisance in urban areas, leading to a divided public opinion. The confusion between the terms 'pigeon' and 'dove' has further obscured the bird's complete story. Originating from the blue rock pigeon, the bird has a long-standing affinity with humans, playing roles in ancient oracles and serving as messengers in wars, including both World Wars. While the white dove remains a symbol of peace, the modern city pigeon faces prejudice, although it has adapted well to urban life. This book explores the rich history of all 179 species of pigeons and doves commemorated on postage stamps globally, shedding light on their characteristics, historical significance, and their role in post and peace, making it a valuable resource for enthusiasts and philatelists.

Book devotes fully illustrated 378 pages to describe The pigeon, bird per se in great details and goes on further to cover various aspects such as Physical features; Pigeon Facts; The Pigeon–The bird as we know; Historical importance; Pigeon as Totem; Coat of arms; The symbolism of the pigeon in



different cultures; Meaning of pigeons in dreams; Species of Pigeon and common varieties on stamps; Fancy breeds of Pigeon; Pigeon as source of Food; Pigeon guano – foul or fantastic?; Why do pigeons bob their head? Pigeons in Wall Street; Mating habits of the pigeon; Pigeons are big business; Navigational capabilities; Famous people and pigeons; Pigeon disasters; Pigeons as lifesavers; Pigeons in the news; Why do you never see a baby pigeon?; What is the natural predator of the pigeon?;Pigeons intelligence and achievements; Pigeon for sport; Habitat loss.
